## with the intention

to generate a measurable, beneficial social or environmental impact

alongside a financial return







## IMPACT INVESTING VS ESG INVESTING

- ➤ Both fall under the umbrella "responsible investing" and are often used interchangeable
- Impact investing focuses on achieving specific and measurable and positive social or environmental outcomes
  - > linked to UN SDG goal(s), most often SDG 3 (good health)
  - > requires investors to measure and report such impact
- ESG investing emphasises incorporating ESG factors into investment decision-making and risk management
  - > requires investors to evaluate a company's ESG performance and practices through data analysis and reporting


